Dr. Shannon Berch is an Emeritus Research Scientist with the BC Ministry of Environment in Victoria and a founding member of the South Vancouver Island Mycological Society and the Truffle Association of British Columbia.

Dr. Andy MacKinnon is a forest ecologist who lives in Metchosin BC. His fields of study include BC's native plants, fungi and lichens. Andy is co-author of six field guides to plants of western North America, an Adjunct Professor in the School of Resource and Environmental Management at Simon Fraser University, and President of the South Vancouver Island Mycological Society.

Shorebird Tracking

Shorebirds have begun their journey south for the winter, stopping at beaches along the way. This fall we are tagging shorebirds in collaboration with Parks Canada and Environment Canada as part of a multi-year project. The radio tags will be detected by receivers along the Pacific coast. We want to see how long birds stay in different coastal areas along their migration.
